Sharing Meadows



Knights of Columbus Council 12951 Joined with other LaPorte and Porter Counties' Knights to spruce up The SHARE Foundation's Sharing Meadows Community.

Five villages make up the Sharing Meadows residential community. Each village has three houses, with two villagers and one steward per house. The villages are located on 200 acres in rural Indiana, where Villagers are able to spend their free time at the swimming pool, by the lake, or in the woods.

The residents work on the grounds five days a week. When they are not at work, the Villagers are free

to relax at home, spend time in town, or whatever they choose. Stewards are always with the Villagers to provide companionship

and guidance, and also to help the Villagers meet their personal goals.

This domestic environment is a unique opportunity for the residents to live as independently as possible, while being supported in a family-like surrounding. Villagers take pride in their work and have formed many meaningful relationships with each other and with the stewards.

The official Feast Day in the Catholic Church of Blessed Father Michael McGivney is August 13. Patron and founder of the Knights of Columbus. The feast is celebrated annually across the universal Catholic Church. Bl. Fr. McGivney was born on August 12, 1852 and passed away on August 14, 1890 (aged 38). His feast day is celebrated on the 13th because it falls between these two dates. Bl. Fr. McGivney was Beatified on October 31, 2020 at the Cathedral of Saint Joseph in Hartford, Connecticut by Cardinal Joseph W. Tobin (on behalf of Pope Francis). This Cathedral is the Diocese Seat for the Bl. Fr. McGivney's shrine that also was the final parish church he served at during his life as a Priest and also where he founded the Knights (Church of Saint Mary in New Haven, Connecticut).
